

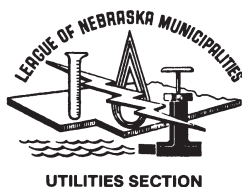
About SWANA

About The Training Session

The municipal solid waste stream is made up of waste from all sectors of society. The waste is often categorized by its source or its characteristics. Regardless of how one classifies wastes, the bottom line is that wastes are collected and delivered to the landfill and a management decision must be made to either reject or accept them. Wastes which are not authorized to be accepted at the landfill create a number of potential problems, including:

- ◆ Liability due to future release of contaminants.
- ◆ Bad publicity if the media learns of unacceptable waste entering the landfill.
- ◆ Potential for worker injury.
- ◆ Exposure to civil or criminal penalties.
- ◆ Damage to collection, transfer, and landfill environmental control systems.

The purpose of this training is to provide collection, transfer, and landfill employees the knowledge about disposal regulations and improve their skills on inspecting wastes to ensure compliance with those regulations.
