of your life.*

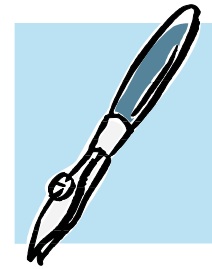

Heartland Clerk's Association Minutes

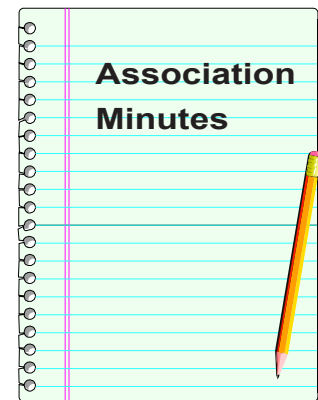
