PRECONFERENCE SEMINAR – "CREATIVE DISTRICTS": Learn how other municipalities are forming creative districts to access funds appropriated by the Legislature to the Nebraska Arts Council. In addition, from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, funds from the Civic and

Community Center Financing Fund (CCCFF) only would be available to municipalities partnering with creative districts certified by the Nebraska Arts Council. The grants shall not be less than \$100,000 or more than \$250,000 regardless of population. After June 30, 2024, grants from the CCCFF will be awarded to municipalities regardless of their partnering with a creative district. Creative districts will help grow the population in Nebraska using the arts as an economic driver, supporting communities in Nebraska in telling their stories and

elevating the value of the arts.
