#### **CMC/MMC Scholarships**

This scholarship program has been designed to assist with the costs of attending an IIMC-approved Institute or Academy program for those working toward IIMC's professional designations. The scholarship program was established in 1986 for Clerks attending IIMC Institutes. Since the program's inception, more than 1,500 scholarships have been awarded.

For the 2020-2021 year, recipients will receive up to a \$400 CMC or \$400 MMC scholarship reimbursement after completion of the program.

The 2020-2021 Scholarship Application Period opened Oct. 1, 2019, and extends through March 1, 2020. Recipients will be selected in April, funding programs taking place between June 1, 2020, and May 31, 2021.


The 2020 Conference Grant Application Period opened Oct. 1, 2019, and will extend through Feb. 12, 2020.

# Economic forecasting board raises revenue projections

The Nebraska Economic Forecasting Advisory Board voted to raise revenue projections for the current fiscal year during an Oct. 24 meeting at the Capitol. The board provides an advisory forecast of general fund receipts that is used by the Legislature to craft the state's budget.

The board's projections for fiscal year 2019-20 were raised based on anticipated increases in revenue receipts across all categories, including \$80 million in corporate income tax and \$50 million in individual income tax.

Total projected revenue receipts for FY2019-20 were raised to \$5.09 billion, an increase of \$161 million.

The board also set the forecast for projected total revenue receipts for FY2020-21 at \$5.15 billion, an increase of \$105 million. The next board meeting is scheduled for Feb. 28, 2020.
